

"The Suffering Servant" Isaiah 52:13-53:9 ◆ Pastor Jim Lennon June 7, 2020

Introduction - Isaiah's fourth Song of the Servant, describes the unexpected suffering of God's Servant. From this song we learn some important things about what the cross of Christ means.

- I. See the Servant!
 - A. We are invited again to take a good, long look at God's Servant.
 - B. Paradoxically, He will prosper and be highly exalted, and also be completely shattered.
 - C. The cross of Jesus was a display of the greatness of God's glory.
 - 1. He will "prosper."
 - 2. He will be "lifted up."

3. He will "sprinkle" many nations.

- II. Believe the Message!
 - A. The counterintuitive message we are asked to believe
 - 1. The Servant reveals the "arm of the Lord."
 - 2. The Servant is very ordinary and unremarkable.
 - B. This verse explains why people will have difficulty with the Messiah, and what is necessary to receive God's salvation.
 - C. The cross upsets our human expectations.

III. Receive His Love!

- A. The message we are to believe and receive:

- C. The Servant's sacrifice was substitutionary.
- D. The Servant's sacrifice was voluntary and undeserved.
