

"Warning, Which Way Are You Going?"

Psalm 2:1-12 ◆ Pastor Jim Lennon January 10, 2021

Introduction - The Psalms introduce us to important aspects of worshiping the Lord, and instructions for how to experience the LORD's blessings in our life. Psalm 1 and 2 introduce us to two of the most important things we need to know and do, in order to draw close to the LORD.

I. The Psalms Are Songs and Prayers.

- A. Psalms 1 & 2 are introductory Psalms that orient us to how to best to connect with and worship God.
- B. We can regard Psalm 1 & 2 as one unit.
 - 1. Psalm 1 begins with God's blessing, Psalm 2 ends with God's blessing.
 - 2. Psalm 1 & 2 share many of the same words:
 - a. "Blessing"
 - b. "Way"
 - c. "Sit"
 - d. "Scoff"
 - e. "Gives"
 - f. "Judgment"
 - g. "Meditate"
 - h. "Destroyed"
- C. The main idea of both Psalms is how we may experience God's blessing in life.

D. Our relationship to God is inseparably linked to our relationship with His Word, and our relationship with His Son.

II. Hear the Decree of the LORD.

- A. Meditating on God's authoritative Word in Psalm 2.
- B. God's anointed king is "the begotten Son of God."
- C. The New Testament affirms that the identity of God's anointed Son is Jesus.

III. Respond to God's Anointed King-Son.

- A. We can either reject the Son, or we can take refuge in the Son.
- B. God's wrath awaits those who reject Him, and God's blessing awaits those who take refuge in Him.
- C. The anointed King-Son becomes the focal point of worship for those who take refuge in Him.
 - 1. "Worship with fear."
 - 2. "Rejoice with trembling."
 - 3. "Kiss the Son."
