 - o Present tense-continues to shine.
- Acts 3: 15 "You killed the source of life, (darkness)
 - o whom God raised from the dead. (continues to shine!)
- Acts 2: 23-24 "...it was impossible for Him to be held by it (death)"
- 2 Timothy 1: 10 "Christ abolished death and brought to light immortality and life."
