- B. But the rabbi Jesus didn't follow rabbi protocol.
- C. Jesus invited people to follow Him.
- D. "Following" Jesus is synonymous with being a "disciple" of Jesus.
- E. There were high expectations of disciples.
- F. Jesus asked Levi to be His disciple.

II. Jesus is a Friend of Sinners.

- A. Levi's other name was Matthew.
- B. To celebrate being asked to become Jesus' disciple, Levi throws a party for Jesus with other tax collectors and sinners, and Jesus shockingly joins them.
