## John-West Sub #10-Notes June 27, 2021

Today is our *final* lesson in the Gospel of John until **September 12**, the Sunday after labor day.

- In the *first Chapter*, the Apostle John tells us *exactly who* Jesus is:
  - o the **Word** became flesh—God Himself became a human being.
- In *Chapter 2* Jesus comes on the scene and *demonstrates* who He is:
  - o turning water into *wine*, and performing many other *signs*.
- In *Chapter 3* Nicodemus, a Pharisee & member of the Sanhedrin, seeks Jesus out, and Jesus begins to tell him why He came.
  - o In order for anyone to **see** the Kingdom of God, including Nicodemus, he **must** be born again! Undergo a regeneration by the Holy Spirit.
- Nicodemus confesses that he has **no idea** what Jesus is talking about.
  - *How can these things be?* (v.9)
- In today's Scripture Jesus is going to *answer* his question--how these things can be.

	who will believe in Him!
	o The Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who in
	Him will have eternal life. (Key concept in John)

	"Trusting" or "believing" is the single major <b>response</b> that Jesus is looking for in human
•	beings.

John 3: 16 (1st use of Love in John's Gospel)
• also, a <u>look back</u> to another <b>type</b> in Genesis 22, where another father, was willing to sacrifice
his "one and only son, the son he loved." <b>Who?</b>
Calvin: "Men are not easily convinced that God them; and so, to remove all doubt, He
has expressly stated that we are so very dear to God, that for our sakes, He did not spare even His
Only begotten Son."
"This verse is the <b>heart</b> of the gospel <b>from</b> the heart of the God who "loved us so much" <b>to</b> the heart of
every individual who needs Him so much."
Nicodemus, "The wonderfully divine way into the Spirit's transformation is simple
in the <b>divine-human Son</b> , given for us."
One commentator summarized <b>John 3: 16</b> this way:
<ul> <li>God's motivation toward people is</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>God's love is limited to a few or to one group of people.</li> </ul>
• His <i>gift</i> is for the world.
• God's love was expressed in the giving of His <b>most gift</b> , His One and only Son.
<ul> <li>On man's side, the gift is simply to be</li></ul>
• He or she will perish, experience ruin in hell, apart from God who is life, truth and joy.
• But will experience a <b>new quality of</b> as a present possession and will possess forever.
John 3: 17
<ul> <li>God sent Jesus into the world on a mission.</li> <li>Paul: "God was in Christ reconciling the world to Himself." (2 Corinthians 5: 19)</li> </ul>
This was a <i>huge</i> undertaking on God's part.
o (1 John: 2: 2) " and not for our sins only, but for the sins of the <b>whole world.</b> "
John 3: 18
• There is a switch from the "world" to the "individual", "anyone, whoever"
<ul> <li>All of usas individualsare <b>drowning</b> in our sin and unbelief!</li> </ul>
<ul><li>Including Nicodemus.</li><li>Without the offered to us by Christ, everyone will drown.</li></ul>
<ul> <li>Without the offered to us by Christ, everyone will drown.</li> <li>What does He mean by "whoever does not believe is condemned already?</li> </ul>
• What does He mean by whoever does not believe is condemned already?
"There is a <i>life-and-death <b>urgency</b> here</i> a decision "for or against" God's <b>free gift</b> of His Son.

## John 3: 19-21 What is the real problem with us?

## John 3: 22-24

- We have come full circle from **John 1: 19** (*After His 40 days in wilderness*)
- Jesus was introduced by John the Baptist: **Lamb of God** who takes away the sin of the world.
- Jesus has traveled with 4 or 5 disciples to Cana for a wedding; then Capernaum (for a few days)
- Then to Jerusalem for Passover, where He overturned the money changers in the Temple.
- He meets with Nicodemus; explained *how* Nicodemus (and *everyone*) could be born of the (Approx. 1 month into His public ministry.) **Spirit** and **enter** the Kingdom of God.
- v. 24 and then back to where John is baptizing. "John had not yet been thrown into prison."
  - o Mark 1: 14-15 (Matthew 4: 12) "After John was arrested, Jesus went to Galilee."
    - John 4: 3 "He left Judea and went again to Galilee"
