## John-West Sub #8-Notes June 6, 2021

## <u>Review</u>

All of these men, *Andrew, Peter, Philip and Nathaniel* (+ unnamed disciple?) appear to have been in close proximity—where John was **baptizing.** 

- Already believing--John's disciples--*ready for the Kingdom/Messiah!*

## Andrew, Peter and Philip were all from *Bethsaida* in Galilee.

Nathaniel (John 21: 2) was from \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Galilee.

- *He is most likely "Bartholomew"* (son of Tholomew)
  - (Simon=Peter; Matthew=Levi; Thaddaeus=Judas, son of James)
- Now they were *all* headed back to their *home region* of *Galilee...for a wedding!*

## Read John 2: 1-12 On the third day (Completes the week)

- v. 1-2 Jesus and his band of *four* or *five* disciples reach their destination:\_\_\_\_\_\_ of Galilee.
  - They had been *invited*.
  - Also invited to the Wedding: "Jesus' mother."
    - (John never refers to her by name: Mary.)
    - Only by "Jesus' mother" (6: 42; 19: 25-27, at the cross, her *only* other references)
    - Nazareth about \_\_\_\_miles away from Cana.
- **v. 3** *"When the wine ran out"* Wedding banquets typically were a week long.
  - o "Jesus' mother told him, 'They don't have any\_\_\_\_\_
  - $\circ$   $\,$  She turned to Jesus, in hope that He could solve the problem.
  - Did she expect a miracle?
- **v. 4** "Woman, what has this concern of yours to do with me? My hour has not yet come."
  - "\_\_\_\_\_" seems a little strange to our ears, BUT it is a polite, kind expression:
    - Used by Jesus with the Woman at the well coming up in Chapter 4,
      - John 4: 19-21
    - Also used by Jesus at the *cross*, as He honors Mary, by *making provision* for her (even as He suffers).
      - John 19: 26 "Woman, here is your son; Here is your mother."
  - "What has this to do with Me? **My\_\_\_\_\_\_ has not yet come.**"
  - What do you think Jesus meant by this?
  - Jesus uses this phrase \_\_\_\_\_ times in John's Gospel:
    - John 2: 4 at the wedding,
    - John 7: 4-9 His brothers—going to the Feast of Tabernacles.
    - John 7: 30 -people trying to seize Him,
    - John 8: 20-21 -no one seized Him because His hour had not come.
  - He also uses the phrase **3 times** when His hour *had come*:
    - John 12: 23 Jesus tells Philip and Andrew, "*The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.*"
    - John 13: 1 Before the Passover Festival Jesus knew that His hour had come to depart from this world." (He then washes—disciples' feet)

- v. 5 Mary tells the servants, "Do whatever He tells you."
  - She is confident He will help.
  - She demonstrates her submission to Him, by \_\_\_\_\_\_ whatever He decides to do.
- **v. 6** Six stone water jars for *Jewish*\_\_\_\_\_

  - 2 or 3 measures = 20 or 30 \_\_\_\_\_(each!) v. 7 Jesus simply says, "Fill the jars with water."
    - It is interesting that "they filled them to the brim!!"
    - Once they had done "*their part*" (They followed Jesus' directions--exceedingly well!!)
    - Jesus does the rest! Something only \_\_\_\_\_ could do!!
- **v. 8** Jesus once again makes a simple command:
  - "Draw some out and take it to the chief servant."
- **v. 9-10** When the chief servant drank it--he was *totally impressed* that *this wine* was of *the* finest quality!
  - \_\_\_\_\_ is celebrated in Scripture-as part of the Kingdom. Amos 9: 13-15, Isaiah 25: 6-8
- v. 11 John tells us that this was the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of Jesus signs, and through it He displayed His • alory.
  - John 1: 14 "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have \_\_\_\_\_ His glory! Glory as of the only Son of the Father!
  - Through this **miraculous sign** Jesus was displaying His \_\_\_\_\_\_**-displaying** who He was.
- John 20: 30-31 John includes this sign to help people believe and receive life in Jesus' name. •
  - Why this sign?
  - What is it pointing to?
  - What is the significance of the 6 stone jars?
    - Covenant-cleansing ritual system
    - Jesus is *replacing/fulfilling* the old system.
      - **v. 9** The chief servant—"*This wine was the superior wine!*"
    - Mark 2: 22 He is the \_\_\_\_\_ Wine-put into New wineskins. • The Old Covenant verses The \_\_\_\_\_ Covenant
    - Jeremiah 31:31-34 Through Jesus' death--establishing the New Covenant! • Luke 22: 20.
- \_\_\_\_\_ in (into) Him. • **v. 11** *His disciples* 
  - Had they believed in Him before?
  - They trusted themselves to Him, *now afresh*, when they see what he does at the wedding.
    - "John is teaching us that *believing is an \_\_\_\_\_\_reality*. Trusting
      - ourselves to Him is a living, repeated daily movement--like breathing or walking."
  - We saw in John 7: 9 that His **brothers** *did* \_\_\_\_\_\_ believe in Him.
    - Why do you think that was?
    - Did they ever become followers of Jesus?
    - Acts 1: 14

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- James–Became the \_\_\_\_\_\_ of the Jerusalem church; New Testament Letter.
- **Jude**—Also wrote a New Testament letter.
