

"First, Decide"

Introduction – After Jesus cleansed the Temple in Jerusalem, the Jewish Sanhedrin confronts Him about His right to do such audacious things.

## I. The Question of Jesus' Authority.

- A. Since the beginning of His ministry Jesus has been exercising bold authority.
- B. Members of the Sanhedrin confront Jesus to ask where He gets the authority to do what He is doing.
- C. The Sanhedrin was the ruling body in Israel comprised of 71 members from four different influential groups.
  - 1. The Pharisees
  - 2. The Chief Priests
  - 3. The Scribes
  - 4. The Elders
- D. The Sanhedrin sent delegates to ask Jesus two questions about His authority: "What?" and "Who?"
- E. Jesus answers their question with a question about where they thought John the Baptist got his authority, from God, or from men?
- F. Jesus' question created a huge dilemma for the Sanhedrin.

## II. The Quagmire of the Sanhedrin's Indecision.

- A. The Sanhedrin remain indecisive and agnostic about the source of John's authority.
- B. Their unwillingness to commit, moves
  Jesus to be unwilling to commit any more
  information to them about Himself.

## III. The Qualification For Knowing God's Will.

- A. Our failure to accept the evidence about Jesus, leaves us in the dark about Jesus.
- B. Our intimacy with God is limited only by the extent of our willingness to surrender to Jesus' authority.
- C. There is plenty of evidence to confirm that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God.

D. There is no neutrality with Jesus. We must first decide about Him, and then God will give us more insight.
