  - 1. The prophecies predicted his betrayal.
  - 2. There is a hint that Satan is behind Judas' actions.
  - 3. Why would Judas do this?
- D. Judas' act was probably triggered by what happened at the dinner party when the woman anointed Jesus with the precious oil.
  - 1. Judas was a Pharisee.
