## I. The Storms God Sends.

- E. God must teach Jonah about His grace.
- F. Jonah hated the Assyrians, believing they were much worse sinners than he was.

- G. Jonah will not be competent to preach God's grace until he learns God's grace.
- H. To teach him grace God intervenes with a storm.
