- H. The sailor's worldview kept them working to save themselves.
- I. But to be saved, they must trust God's substitute for them.

II. The Repentance of Jonah.

- B. Jonah admits his sin, repents and surrenders his life to God.
- C. Jonah's trust is in YHWH.
- D. The sailors must trust YHWH and His substitute to be saved.
