- B. The Gospel of Luke is the preamble to Luke's writing the Acts of the Apostles.

II. The Crux of Christianity.

- A. Luke explains that Christianity rises or falls on the truth of Jesus' resurrection from the dead.
- B. Luke maintains that there are many convincing proofs that Jesus physically rose from the dead.

III. Many Convincing Proofs.

- A. After His death, Jesus appeared to Peter, the twelve, and more than 500 people at the same time. (See I Corinthians 15:3-9)
- B. Jesus appeared to people alive repeatedly for 40 days after He was declared dead.
- C. But everyone has a hard time believing it.
