- B. Up until 300 AD there were at least 10 systematic persecutions of Christians in the Roman empire, where they were imprisoned, plundered, tortured, and killed.
- C. And yet, they kept on witnessing about Jesus and giving grace to their persecutors.
- D. Acts 4 and 5 suggest how and why they were able to do that.
