 - 1. God leads Philip to change his plans.
 - 2. God leads Philip to run up to a chariot
- B. God was working behind the scenes to prepare the Ethiopian Eunuch to hear the Gospel.

II. The Witness Speaking.

- F. Baptism is the outward sign of belief in Jesus.
