I. Wait on God Patiently.

- A. The word “wait” means to be patient.
- B. “Waiting” isn’t passive. Waiting patiently is the result of two deliberate actions.
 - 1. Humility
 - 2. Recognizing an opportunity.

II. Wait on God Prospectively.
